As you well know I am passionate about the need for Christians to learn to translate the teachings of Christianity into words and images that 21st century people can understand. I've shared with you from time to time about how often I've met lapsed members of churches who'd dutifully and joyfully brought their children up in the faith. They did lots of great volunteer work, served on committees, launched into outreach activities and taught Sunday School, for example. And they also tended to drift away after their children left the nest.

They found themselves in a spiritual vacuum. Nothing filled the hole left by the cessation of all the activities associated with child-rearing years in the church. In particular, they tell me how they cannot accept, on an intellectual level, the words of the Creeds and Bible and many of the prayers. The ancient language is opaque to them, and a stumbling block to further spiritual development, at least in the Christian Church. For the many Christians who remain (happily, even), intellectual assent to the Creeds and doctrines of Christianity as they've been received from antiquity, verbatim, is the assumed prerequisite to being a Christian in good standing.

Historically, many in the last century have been more concerned with accepting Church doctrines than taking comfort and finding new life in living as ambassadors for Jesus in today's world. I meet these "exiles" everywhere. And, of course, this is not the only reason people drifted away from Ascension or "organized religion." But this is one area that we can address head on. There are many marvelous resources for those of us who feel drawn to a ministry of learning to "speak Christian" so that we can bring those "lost sheep" back into our fold.

I for one have always felt a "call" to do this, and to complement the reshaping and updating of Christian thought and speech with practical instruction in techniques that will enable *anybody* to deepen her conscious awareness of God.

In the program year to come watch for classes that will help us all become better ambassadors.
